

Chapter 10

Education

Mentally Developed Knowledge

Education is the process of developing knowledge to one's full mental capacity implemented by way of facts, instructions, and guidance. Education is *knowledge*; knowledge is *power*, however this power is merely harnessed, the *choices* we make with such knowledge will actually declare the overall eminence. Knowledge alone cannot replace *wisdom*. Wisdom is the accumulation of every facet of education; a "been there done that" type of thing. All the knowledge in the world doesn't amount to *experience*.
